PASTOR CHRIS' CORNER



This Lenten journey can, at times seem like a long one, although it is nothing compared to this past winter! (Sorry, I had to get a winter jab in there somewhere, and you knew it was probably coming). Regardless, the challenging part of long journeys is how they can often test many traits and qualities we do not always like having

tested. Patience, for one, is certainly something we have to just either accept, or spend fruitless effort, energy, and time being frustrated over. Often times too, it is not like we have much choice in the matter. If we are counting down the days to an anticipated vacation, we cannot selfishly make time go faster, other than occupying ourselves somehow. If we want our car to be warmed we have to start it ahead of time, and cannot have instant heat. And, if we are anxious to one day see the loved ones that have gone before us then we too, must wait.

The point is, these journeys do serve a purpose, although at times they may seem excessive or pointless. But, let's face it, how different would it affect us if we could attain every single thing instantly? Would we lose our appreciation for relationships if we never had to wait to visit friends and family, or count down the days until they see us? Would we appreciate the efforts put into farming if there was no such thing as planting, fertilizing, nourishing, and harvesting? Or, would we even have patience if it was not tested and challenged from time to time? Through this waiting period we are provided the opportunity to learn, to grow, and to work on areas that we do not always like to have worked on. The journey of Lent allows us to further appreciate Easter. Through our own "giving up" or "taking on" during this Lenten season we get a sense (if not a mere glimpse) of Christ's own sacrificial excursion. As hard as they may be, they are a fact of life. These journeys allow us to grow as Christians, to appreciate more events, things, and people, and they allow us to understand the importance of our own relationship with God. As this Lenten season eventually comes to a close, let us think of how we might have grown, or what we might have learned these past forty days.

The Book of Order – G-3.01 General Principles of Councils – G3.0105 – Meetings



Meetings of councils shall be opened and closed with prayer. Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the most recent edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*, except when it is in contradiction to this Constitution. Councils may also make use of processes of discernment in their deliberations prior to a vote as agreed upon by the body.




Words of wisdom regarding the chair lifts

We want to let folks know that we will try to keep the remaining lifts safe and operating as long as possible. However, we should be aware that the company that made them is out of business and our ability to get repair parts will be severely limited. Also, the conditions we found when the tower entrance chair was removed leads us to expect breakdown(s) sooner rather than later.

On February 23, 2014, Grace Presbyterian Church dedicated our new elevator.

Here are some ways the elevator serves us...

- The elevator is convenient to all areas of the church.
- A nice parking lot with plenty of lighting and a ramp serves the Elevator Lobby entrance.
- There is a camera there so the church office can monitor the Elevator Lobby entrance doors.
- We are working on restoring the capability to unlock the door after hours.
- We are working on obtaining a utility cart that will roll easily in and out of the elevator and one that will not mar or damage the interior walls of the elevator.
- We are working on getting a protective liner for the occasions when we need to move such items as the floor-cleaning machine.



Capital Campaign Committee

We are now in year two of our three-year capital campaign fulfillment period. As most of you know, we executed a capital campaign drive to fund the accessibility improvements that have been completed in the last few months at Grace. During the campaign 52 families pledged \$200,910.00. Total dollars as of February 28th paid to date against those pledges are \$119,990.10. The remainder of the pledges will be paid during 2014 and 2015. These pledges will allow us to retire the loan that we took to pay our contractors for the construction project. The project was run very well by Grace building committee members and our contractors and we came in slightly under budget. This money, along with the grant money we received last year from Smock, will allow the building committee to assess the other accessibility issues that we still need or want to complete. These will likely include upgrading some of our restrooms to be more handicap friendly, addressing sound issues in the sanctuary for those with hearing impairment, as well as finishing the areas that were under construction that are currently unfinished by replacing the flooring. Depending on how much money is available they may also be able to address other projects the congregation has expressed as a priority.


