# GENERAL ASSEMBLY OPEN LETTER DETROIT 2014

Friends, as most of you are probably well aware; there was a General Assembly meeting this year in Detroit, Michigan. For those who might not know, the General Assembly is the highest governing body of the Presbyterian Church (USA). This body of our denomination meets



bi-annually to discuss, discern, learn, pray, and vote on many of the matters concerning the world, the denomination, presbyteries, and particular congregations. Two major decisions (which most of you may have heard by now – either through credible sources, or perhaps through some other less-credible and misinformed sources) were on the issues of the divestment of funds in the Middle East and the authority of the pastor to perform same-sex marriages. Both of these topics stirred-up quite the debate. But, let us look at what exactly the decisions mean for us, or what we can learn from them.

First, let us discuss the divestment issue. By a narrow margin (a mere 7 votes out of the hundreds of voting delegates) it was approved to remove denominational investments from three specific companies: Motorola, Hewlett Packard, and Caterpillar. The reason these three companies were targeted specifically was because of their contributions to the unrest and hostility between Israel and Palestine. Specifically, Motorola provides military communications and surveillance systems in illegal Israeli settlements. Hewlett Packard has extensive involvement with the Israeli army and provides electronic systems at checkpoints, logistics and communications systems to support the naval blockade of the Gaza Strip, as well as business relationships with illegal settlements in the West Bank. Finally, we know that Caterpillar provides bulldozers used in the destruction of Palestinian homes and for clearing land of structures and fruit and olive tree groves in preparation for construction of the barrier wall. It is due to these products and what they are used for that the course of action of divestment was recommended to the greater body.

It should be noted that by no means is this a divestment from the actual State of Israel, nor is it an anti-Semitic based decision or intention. Instead, the focus falls solely on the process of peacekeeping in the Middle East. In closing to this topic, I will give you a quote directly from the PCUSA website on the issue of divestment; with the question asked: "what is the point of divestment?" "For Presbyterians individually, and collectively, investments offer not only financial return, but represent a form of constructive partnership for good in the world. Divestment is always a last resort, as a matter of faithful stewardship, when it becomes apparent that an investment can no longer be part of a constructive partnership for good. Presbyterians believe firmly that their investments must be in alignment with their values." (http://www.pcusa.org/site\_media/media/uploads/oga/pdf/ga221-middle-east-faq.pdf)

Secondly, the ongoing issue of homosexual marriage was again brought to light. This time though, the governing body enacted what is called (Authoritative Initiative); basically, the primary body's interpretation of our constitution (The Book of Order and The Book of Common Worship) deemed it that pastors (Teaching Elders) should be allowed to perform same-sex marriages. As a result, this action and decision makes it effective immediately for all ordained PC(USA) pastors. Now, it should be noted that pastors individually still have what is referred to as "local choice." Meaning, it is up to each individual pastor whether or not they will marry a couple, whether they be homosexual or heterosexual. By no means is this a mandate telling pastors who they can or cannot marry. Merely, this is a decision that will absolve a pastor of ecclesial discipline should they perform a same-sex marriage. Also, the marrying of a same-sex couple can only occur in states in which it is legalized. (CONTINUED ON PAGE 2)

As these two proceedings were both an upper-echelon denominational decision, they are not actions that will

need to be voted on by Presbyteries. Instead, they are effective immediately. On the side of divestment, that is just with the funds from the denomination's portfolio, and while they are encouraging local congregations to follow suit, it is not yet a mandate for particular churches. The marriage topic, as mentioned, was deemed as an Authoritative Interpretation, and is also not up for Presbytery vote. However, some proposed changes to the wording in the Book of Worship and the potential addition of the Belhar Confession to the Book of Confessions will go before Presbyteries for a vote.

I hope you now have a better understanding of what transpired at the General Assembly level. However, if you have any further guestions or concerns regarding these matters, by all means feel free to contact me (Pastor Chris) via e-mail, phone call, or even with an office visit. We all may not agree with some of the decisions made by the General Assembly. Some may rejoice, others may mourn over some of the choices made. Yet, in part, the ability to have different opinions is a portion of the beauty of the Presbyterian Church (USA). At the end of the day, we are all united in Christ, and we are all brothers and sisters in Christ, so we should love one another accordingly. May God's peace and grace be with you all.

### The Book of Order – G-3.05 The General Assembly



G-3.0501- Composition and Responsibilities – The General Assembly is the council of the whole church and it is representative of the unity of the synods, presbyteries, sessions, and congregations of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)....The General E Assembly constitutes the bond of union, community, and mission among all its congregations and councils, to the end that the whole church becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness. As it leads and guides the witness of the whole church, it shall keep before it the marks of the Church (F-1.0303), the notes by which Presbyterian and Reformed communities have identified themselves through history (F-1.0303) and the six Great Ends of the Church (F-1.0304).

The Book of Confessions - The Westminster Confession of Faith

### Chapter IV – Of Creation – 6.023

2. After God had made all other creatures, he created man, male and female, with reasonable and immortal souls, endued with the knowledge, righteousness, and true holiness after his own image, having the law of Go written in their hearts, and power to fulfill it; and yet under a possibility of transgressing, being left to the liberty of their own will, which was subject unto change. Besides this law written in their hearts, they received a command not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil; which while they kept they were happy in their communion with God, and had dominion over the creatures.

# NHCL 4th Annual Golf Scramble



Our design build Team used for the previous construction will work this project with the Grace Building Committee. There are no timelines established yet for this project. You will notice some improvements in the lower level Women's restroom already which were completed by Dennis Allen & Aaron Bowers. Sometime in late August or September, we will be trialing a new speaker system in the Sanctuary to help improve the audibility in this area for those who have difficulty with hearing.
