

Just recently I watched a very informative "2 minute video" for Advent, done by a company called "broken halo." The video was really informative, and helps one to remember and focus on what the season of Advent truly means and represents. It is a subtle reminder of how much we can often get wrapped up

(pun intended) in focusing solely on Christmas, that we forget the journey that brings us to Christmas in the first place. I would encourage you to try and Google the video if you get a chance. It can help to serve to inform and remind us about the many meanings the season of Advent carries with it.

Presbyterianism 101



The Book of Order – G-1.03 The Membership of a Congregation – G-1.0301– The Meaning of Membership and Baptism

In Jesus Christ, God calls people to faith and to membership in the Church, the body of Christ. Baptism is the visible sign of that call and claim on a human life and of entrance into

membership of the church. The baptism of children witnesses to the truth that God's love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. The baptism of those who enter the covenant of membership upon their own profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior witnesses to the truth that God's gift of grace calls forth a response of faithfulness. Thus, the triune God, incarnate in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, gives to the Church not only its mission but also its understanding of membership.

The Book of Confessions - The Second Helvetic Confession - Chapter XX - Of Holy Baptism 5.186

ONE BAPTISM. There is but one baptism in the Church of God; and it is sufficient to be once baptized or consecrated unto God. For baptism once received continues for all of life, and is a perpetual sealing of our adoption.

October/November 2014 Session Highlights

- Session approved that baptism request for Charlotte Marie Jacobs, which took place on Sunday, November 23rd.
- The session recommended to the congregation to reduce the board of deacons from a size of 12 to a size of 9, citing difficulty in attaining people to fulfill the vacancies for the class of 2017.
- ♦ A new 15 passenger "Turtle-Top" van, courtesy of the very generous Smock Foundation was approved to be purchased by them, and shared by both Grace Presbyterian and United Faith Presbyterian Churches. The hope is that these vans can allow home-centered members to attend worship more regularly. Plus, this would offer the respective churches some flexibility to take large groups to events.




