

PASTOR CHRIS' CORNER



The months of February and March may seem like a time for spring. But, the calendar continues to tell us that it is winter, at least until the date of March 20th, where spring officially begins. Some of us enjoy the season of winter; the beauty that it brings across the landscape of the earth.

Others meanwhile, may wait with eager anticipation for the spring showers. Some of us prefer having the heat up as high as it can go while waiting out the winter. Some of us thoroughly enjoy the cold as we open our windows on these brisk nights to get a sense of freshness about the room. To me, that is the true beauty of seasons and wonderment of God: the ability to create four very different times of the year that suits the tastes and preferences of so many unique people.

Understanding these different seasons and the varied tastes of people that experience them, it is no wonder then, that some of us gain more energy at night, while others are early-risers. The Book of Order – G-2.01 Ordered Ministries Of The Church –

G-2.0101 – Christ's Ministry

The Church's ministry is a gift from Jesus Christ to the whole Church. Christ alone rules, calls,

teaches, and uses the Church as he wills, exercising his authority by the ministry of women and men for the establishment and extension of God's new creation. Christ's ministry is the foundation and standard for all ministry, the pattern of the one who came "not to be served but to serve" (Matt. 20:28). The basic form of ministry is the ministry of the whole people of God, from whose midst some are called to ordered ministries, to fulfill particular functions. Members and those in ordered ministries serve together under the mandate of Christ.

The Book of Confessions - The Westminster Confession of Faith - Chapter XXIII - Of Religious Worship and the Sabbath Day 6.116

5. The reading of the Scriptures with godly fear; the sound preaching, and conscionable hearing of the Word, in obedience unto God with understanding, faith, and reverence; singing of psalms with grace in the heart; as, also, the due administration and worthy receiving of the sacraments instituted by Christ; are all parts of the ordinary religious worship of God: besides religious oaths, and vows, solemn fastings, and thanksgivings upon special occasion; which are, in their several times and seasons, to be used in an holy and religious manner.




MISSION TRIP DONATIONS NEEDED FOR COMPASSION VISIT
