

#### PASTOR CHRIS' CORNER



Abundance and Scarcity seem to be a predominant theme these days in the news. In California, there is an extreme scarcity of rain, to the point that there are water restrictions and people are going to extreme measures to make their lawns green! A couple of the options I have seen include spray-painting one's lawn green and even replacing one's lawn with an artificial turf. The latter of

which does not sound like a bad idea to me, it means less mowing! Now, on the other side of the coin, we have the poor state of Texas which has experienced some deadly flash floods. Now, this is the kind of abundance that is neither beneficial nor appreciated by any party, particularly the one affected the most by it. Some people have lost their lives due to the flooding, and there is bound to be an astonishing amount of property damage that will occur as a result of the flooding too.

Now, with these sad situations it got me thinking; when we look on these situations it would be beneficial for all parties involved if we could, somehow, move the abundance of unwanted water that Texas is now experiencing, and give some of that excess water to those that need it desperately in California. To me, that would be a win for all parties involved, it would save lives, it would provide life to the foliage in California, and give the residents a break from the heat. In fact, after having lived through a couple Indiana winters, I feel the same way about the winter and summer months, wishing there was some technological way to bottle up heat from the summer to use in the winter, and cold from the winter to use in the summer.

I often feel this is what God calls us to do when it comes to our giving, offerings, and tithes. We are called to give the blessings and abundance we have been given, and are provided opportunities to share with those who live in a world of scarcity. Now, this is not saying that our abundance is a bad abundance. Merely, it is a wonderful chance to do what God calls us to do many times throughout scripture: Share abundantly with others what we have been freely given, whether that be finances, gifts, abilities, knowledge, or time, there is bound to be something we have in abundance. Here are two specific Scripture verses that tell us just that: 1) "Freely you have received, freely give." (Matthew 10:8b NRSV) and 2) "The one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly; the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." With that in mind, I invite you to reflect prayerfully on the weather situations and how God might be calling you to share your own blessings, talents, gifts, and time.

In Baptism, we participate in Jesus' death and resurrection. In Baptism, we die to what separates us from God and are raised to newness of life in Christ. Baptism points us back to the grace of God expressed in Jesus Christ, who died for us and

who was raised for us. Baptism points us forward to that same Christ who will fulfill God's purpose in God's promised future.

## The Book of Confessions - The Second Helvetic Confession - Chapter XX - Of Holy Baptism [We Are Baptized With Water] 5.188

And therefore we are baptized, that is, washed or sprinkled with visible water. For the water washes dirt away, and cools and refreshes hot and tired bodies. And the grace of God performs these things for souls, and does so invisibly or spiritually.



#### "The Good Life and A Life of Service"

Grace Presbyterian was the site of a luncheon workshop May 12th sponsored by Center for Congregations.

The workshop was led by Reb Rebele, a guest lecturer in the Master of Applied Positive Psychology program at the University of Pennsylvania. He offered a blend of instructional presentation, personal reflection and group activities and discussion to inform and equip congregational leaders to support congregants' pursuit of a deeper life fulfillment as they serve their congregation and community.

Pursuit of "the good life," improving one's own well-being, can sometimes seem to be at odds with a deep call to a life of service. This is especially true when service is understood as improving the lives of others at potentially significant personal cost. Some researchers have started to look at the intersection between the two to help us figure out how we can give as much as possible to others while still taking good care of ourselves.

For many people, congregations are the central organization they can turn to for guidance on both how to take care of themselves and how to offer help to others. Congregational life can offer unique opportunities for cultivating some of the central elements of the good life, such as meaning, purpose and community. It also offers built-in opportunities for service, whether through volunteer opportunities, support groups or charity. And though congregations are rich in theological, philosophical and personal sources of wisdom about the good life and the life of service, empirical research from the social sciences offers complementary insights and ideas for how to connect with and support the pursuits of their congregants.

Attending from Grace were Rev. Chris Kirwan and Pat Morrison. Tammy Menkes and Nancy Current volunteered to set up and tear down tables, drinks, and assist with the catered lunch for the 25 people that attended from many different churches in the area.
