PASTOR CHRIS' CORNER



As I sat down to write this month's newsletter article, pondering what to write, one particular word kept popping up in my head: balance. It is a word that seems to be making a lot of appearances in my life lately. I have spotted it in Facebook posts, in news articles, used in various blogs, on television, etc. I just seemed to run into

it around every corner. Well, in congruence with those occurrences, I figured it would be good to actual speak about this emphasis of balance. You see, in this life we need balance. I feel there is a good reason that God made both day and night. Not to mention, that we have been commanded to also acknowledge the Sabbath and keep it Holy. It was that we would hold at least some semblance of balance in our own lives. It also would seem (at least in my own life) that I become more stressed, anxious, and impatient when my sense of balance is thrown off. If I have a busy week due to work or have not had a chance to tend to my spiritual needs and nourish that aspect of my life, then I feel thrown off-balance due to the lack of it being present.

Yet, I cannot help but think how many areas of not only our lives, but in the world, balance is essential. For our ecosystem, it is critical that a good, healthy balance is maintained. Otherwise, we run the risk of upsetting that balance and throwing everything off; some creatures can become extinct, others may have to migrate to other areas to avoid a lack of resources or an abundance of predators. There is a built-in checks and balances system, and one that requires a good balance to maintain. Similarly, in our own lives, if, dietwise, we consume too much of one food-type then our bodies begin to get out of balance. If we eat too much sugar, we may receive a quick burst of energy, but it quickly fizzles sapping us of long-term strength, endurance, and energy.

In regards to our own spiritual life, and well-being, I too, feel that balance is a crucial piece to the puzzle. It is humanly impossible to read the Bible 24 hours a day 7 days a week. In fact, most activities, no matter how much we might love them, we need to take a step back and take a break from them every once in a while. This, is natural, and is to be expected. Of course, we do not want to lean too far in the other direction either. We do not want to abstain from even picking up a Bible or fail to pray at least periodically. This then, is where the balance comes in. When we ask, do we need to work or rest? Well, we need both to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Do we consume nothing but health foods, or can we enjoy a treat every once-in-a-while? Here, again, maintaining a balance is key. Do we pray ceaselessly, or can we take a break and pray in moments that occasionally work better for us? Or, do we need to feel guilty about not reading Scripture daily, or can we find out a routine or system in which we can remain spiritually fed outside of church? The answer to that, of course, again, is balance. In order to maintain our sanity, our health, and remain in a place where we will not come to resent or neglect our physical, emotional, and spiritual health, we must focus on a word that God has created since the genesis of the world, that of balance.

Presbyterianism 101



The Book of Order – G-3.02 The Session – *G-3.0303Meetings*

The session shall hold stated meetings at least quarterly. The moderator shall call a special meeting when he or she deems necessary or when requested in writing by

any two members of the session. The business to be transacted at special meetings shall be limited to items specifically listed in the call for the meeting. There shall be reasonable notice given of all special meetings. The session shall also meet when directed by presbytery. Sessions shall provide by rule for a quorum for meetings; such quorum shall include the moderator and either a specific number of ruling elders or a specific percentage of those ruling elders in current service on the session.

The Book of Confessions - The Shorter Catechism

Q. 40. What did God at first reveal to man for the rule of his obedience? A. The rule which God at first revealed of man for his obedience was the moral law.

Q. 41 Where is the moral law summarily comprehended? A. The moral law is summarily comprehended in the Ten Commandments.

Q. 42. What is the sum of the Ten Commandments? A. The sum of the Ten Commandments is: to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.

Church Women United is planning for The Inter-Faith Luncheon, set for October 5, 2015 at Ceruti's.


The luncheon brings women together from many denominations to share their faith and enrich their spirituality through music and the Bible. More information on registration will be in Sunday bulletins prior to the event.

Newly Painted Pillars!






Welcome Ezekiel Tsamwa & Family!



♦ Toddler/Preschool classes: 9:30-10:00 am

We offer a Toddler/Preschool class to those between the ages of 1 and 4! Come join Ms. Holly as she teaches the children stories about the Bible and Jesus! Usually, there is a picture or two depicting a scene from the Bible and fun crafts that the children partake in.

♦ Kindergarten – 5th Grade: 9:00-10:00 am

These classes are taught by Mrs. Cathy, and she is one of the kids' favorite teachers! There is almost so much stuff that goes on in this classroom that it would be better to list what they don't do!
