I hope those of you that are participating in the church-wide study of "God Is Just Not Fair" are getting a lot out of the study. The benefits can be wide-ranging and many of them reflect our potential hopes for when we first began planning this study. For starters, each group, whether they

are one of the weeknight groups, Sunday school groups, or online group, has the opportunity to learn more about one another in said group. This, of course, enhances relationships and may help new ones take shape or form that were not present beforehand. The basis of confidentiality and the presence of others can make for a rather enlightening and meaningful experience for all involved.

In addition to that potential benefit, one also has the chance to heighten their theological understanding and perhaps deepen their own faith. The main focus of the book is centered on theodicy, which is a fancy way of essentially saying: "the bad things that happen in life; or, more specifically why evil exists in the world." The author, Jennifer Rothschild writes it even from her own perspective of blindness and how it has greatly affected and impacted her own life. I highly recommend this book despite whether or not you have decided to participate in the church-wide study. Of course, the conversations and discussions with others is very fruitful. But, we know not everyone is afforded that opportunity. I have found though, one of the greatest assets and biggest blessings of ministry is to have time to read abundantly and keep on learning. We are never too old to learn. So, keep on reading!

Q. 28. What advantage comes from acknowledging God's creation and providence?

A. We learn that we are to be patient in adversity, grateful in the midst of blessing, and to trust our faithful God and Father for the future, assured that no creature shall separate us from his love, since all creatures are so completely in his hand that without his will they cannot even move.
