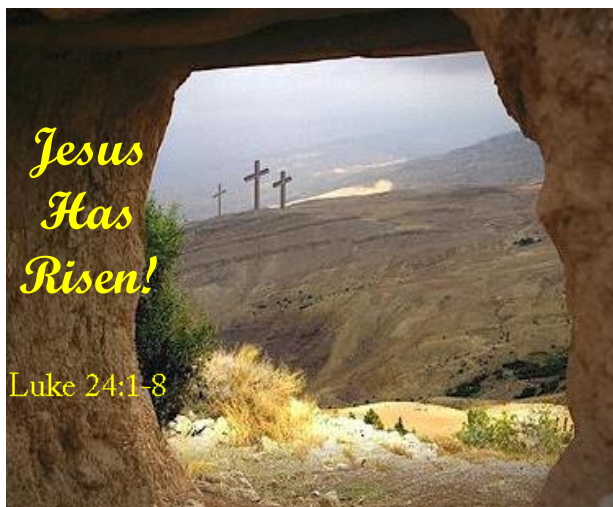

*Hello from Rev. Ann Pitman...*

It seems that the past month has flown by. I remember receiving the call from Stacey Monnier inviting me to serve as your Interim Pastor and the rest has been a blur. I spent almost 2 weeks in Easton, PA with my daughter for Christmas. This is the first time I have been able to be in her home for Christmas. Usually I have Christmas Eve obligations in the church I am serving, so this was a real treat. Kimberlee is a Forensic Debate Coach and Team Administrator at Lafayette College, in Easton, PA. She is a member of First Presbyterian Church in Easton and sings in their choir.

December 29, the day I was leaving Easton to head back to Ashland, we received word that my mother's last living cousin (at almost 103 years of age) had died that morning so it was a fast trip back to Ashland to leave Haleigh, my dog, in the Kennel in order to drive to Indianapolis, pick up my 94-year-old mother, and drive to Jacksonville, IL for her cousin's funeral service on December 31. We were able to visit with several of my cousins in Illinois and visit the farm my mother's family has lived on since 1873. We drove back to Indianapolis January 1, and I returned to Ashland on January 2. The movers arrived on Monday, January 4. I picked up Haleigh from the kennel on the 5<sup>th</sup> and drove to Fort Wayne. Whew! Two and a half weeks later, I am almost unpacked.

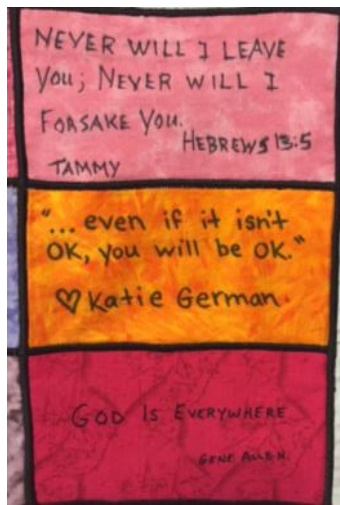
I can't tell you how wonderful it was to be met at the Manse at 9:30 PM by Tammy. She had closed all the blinds so that I could have some privacy. She had an envelope with all the keys, and the garage door openers. There was toilet paper in both bathrooms as well as a shower curtain and liner in the bathtub which was wonderful! I didn't have to wonder in which box or tote I had put those items.

I am blown away by how nice the manse is. For almost 25 years I have heard horror stories about church manses so I am beyond excited to be living in such a nicely maintained home. (I am also enjoying NOT having a family living above me that are heavy on their feet with a 3 year old who runs all the time, the situation I lived with the past year in an apartment.) I have lived in apartments for the last 5 years and probably will again when I leave here, but in the meantime, I am really enjoying the extra space, and the quiet. And for the first time in her life, Haleigh can go outside without being on a leash. She is not sure what to make of it but I LOVE IT!

Every person I have come into contact with since my arrival has been very gracious and welcoming. I do appreciate when you wear name tags on Sunday, or remind me of your name when I see you during the week. I will make every effort to learn your names and faces but I do need your help. I also appreciate your help in knowing who is in need of a call or who is missing from worship. I would much rather have 10 people tell me that someone is in the hospital than find out later that someone was in the hospital and everyone who knew it thought someone else must have told me already so they didn't. Not that I think the pastor is the only one who should make hospital visits, but there is no way I can make a call if I don't know someone is in the hospital. My cell phone number is: 260-267-1196. Please make note of it and feel free to call me if you need me.

I am planning to take Friday as my day off and while I appreciate people understanding my need for time off, **if there is an emergency**, please call me and let me know. If the call can wait, then please wait until Monday.
