Mission Study Review Team Report

The Mission Study Review team presented their report to Session at the July 12 meeting. Several questions were asked and the report was approved by Session with the additional changes suggested. The report will be sent to COM for their consideration at their July 27th meeting.

Next Steps—Election of a PNC

Once the Mission Study Review is approved by the Session and Committee on Ministry (COM) we will be authorized to elect the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). The Nominating Committee will put together a slate of the members willing to serve. A congregational meeting will be called. The slate will be presented. As Book of Order requires, additional names can be put into nomination from the floor. Prior to putting someone's name into nomination be sure to ask the person if they are willing to serve if elected. The congregation will then vote to elect the members of the PNC.

The PNC will be responsible for writing the MIF (Ministry Information Form) which is entered online on the denominations Church Leadership Connection (CLC). It will then be available for anyone seeking a call to read and respond. There is an element of computer matching that is done by CLC based on the leadership characteristics the PNC lists on the MIF. Pastors can also "self-refer" to a church that is looking. In addition, Presbytery staff may make referrals when asked for assistance by a pastor, or congregation. (Some do more of that than others.)

Now is the time to learn "Presbyspeak"

Jack was the first person at camp that Bill Zion introduced me to, back in 1979; and I served as Camp Maintenance Chairman and later Camp Property Chairman for 24 years under Jack's leadership. Bill served as Camp Master Chairman for more years than I can remember. Camp Masters are the volunteers who keep the camp open over the weekends and during the off season.

222nd General Assembly – first Person Report



I first attended a General Assembly in 1994, one year after being ordained as a "Minister of Word and Sacrament" by the Presbytery of Central Florida, on behalf of Whitewater Valley Presbytery. Since that time I have attended GA's in Cincinnati, OH, Fort Worth, TX, while serving as Vice Moderator of the Presbytery; Columbus, OH, Detroit, MI, and now, Portland, OR. I am kind of a "GA junkie." I love seeing the Holy Spirit move through the commissioners, observers, staff and resource persons, overture advocates, *and* Robert's Rules of Order.

The 222nd GA was the first general assembly since I was ordained that was not predicted to split the denomination in two over one controversial issue or another. By comparison, it was really quite tame, but not without its own history making events! The 222nd General Assembly (2016) of the PC(USA) celebrated two historic events—electing two women as co-moderators for the first time and electing the first African American as the PC(USA)'s new Stated Clerk, the highest ecclesiastical office in the 1.5-million-member denomination. Always before we have had a Moderator and a Vice Moderator. IF the Moderator was a woman then the vice moderator was ALWAYS a man. The opposite, however did not automatically follow.

There were 14 different committees. I especially wanted to follow the work of Committee #8 dealing with the Middle East issues. Having visited in Israel/Palestine in 2012 with the Indiana Center for Middle East Peace, I have become very aware of how our national media does not report on both sides of the issues evenly. Our national media tends to be very biased toward Israel and against the Palestinians. No one wants to offend the Israelis, as if any complaint might be perceived as being Anti-Semitic, a concern lifted up repeatedly at GA.

On my visit we were intentionally meeting with the local people living there "the Living Stones", both Palestinians and Israelis in order to learn what is happening to them. We read books before going written by some of the people we met with, and read more when we returned. One of the statements made by Abuna Elias Chacour, Archbishop of Galilee, was: "Please, please tell people, when you go home that not all Palestinians are terrorists!"

We visited with Rev. Mitri Raheb, pastor of Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem. He has been instrumental in founding the DAR AL-KALIMA University College in Bethlehem as a means of educating the children of Palestine, to live life abundantly, as Jesus promised. ("I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." John 10:10.) Dar Al-Kalima University College is one of the recipients of a loan from the Presbyterian Foundation as a result of the 221st GA's call for **positive** investment in Palestine when the decision was made to divest from companies unwilling to discuss the use of their products to destroy Palestinian fields, homes, schools, hospitals, etc. (We also visited the College.)

The PC(USA) General Assemblies have repeatedly and consistently recognized:

- Israel's right to exist as a sovereign state within secure, internationally recognized borders
- Palestinians' right to self-determination, including the right to establish a neighboring independent, sovereign state
- The desire of all to establish a just and durable peace to which the end of occupation is essential

They continue to do so, however, they are also lifting up the social justice issues of people living in the region. Whether the eventual solution can be a two state solution is in serious doubt now as the number of illegal settlements in Palestinian land continues to increase. The facts are available and very disheartening. I am happy to discuss this topic with anyone in further detail.


 Many thanks to John Currant and Dennis Allen for their work refinishing the banisters in the Manse while I was gone to GA. They are beautiful!

PC(USA) celebrates 60 years of women clergy

This year marks the 60th anniversary of women teaching elders in the PC(USA). On October 24, 1956, the Rev. Margaret Towner was ordained as the first woman minister in the Presbyterian Church. Despite the attention and recognition, she received—her photo was featured in *Life* magazine and other publications—Towner said she "chose to avoid the limelight and continue my work in the local congregation."

Towner recently celebrated her 91st birthday, and though honorably retired, she is still an active member of her presbytery. In 2015-2016, 110-years of women deacons and 85 years of women ruling elders is also being celebrated. Elder Sarah Dickson was the first woman ruling elder, and Elder Tillie Paul Tamaree was the first Native American woman ruling elder, both ordained in 1930, and there have been numerous women deacons over the past 110 years.

In 1994 when I served the Presbytery of Whitewater Valley as one of their "clergy" commissioners to the General Assembly, my roommate was a clergy commissioner from Ohio, who had just transitioned from one congregation to another. Her daughter, son-in-law, and young grandson had been members of her first congregation since they lived nearby. After she left, her family transferred their membership to a church closer to their home. That congregation had a male pastor. In a phone call with her grandson soon after they began attending the grandson was so excited to tell his grandmother about their new "man" pastor. He went on to say, "Grandma! I didn't know I could grow up to be like you!"

Did you know?

With the 4 most prominent leaders in our denomination: 2 are female (Co-Moderators Anderson and Edmiston), two are African American (newly elected Stated Clerk J. Herbert Nelson, and Co-Moderator Anderson), and 1, Puerto Rican-Mexican-American Latino man, Executive Director of the Presbyterian Mission Agency Tony De La Rosa.

So while many congregations consist of predominately one race, our face is becoming much more multi-cultural.
