Pastor's Ponderings

One of the many blessings of being a pastor has been the opportunity to be with families when a loved one dies. To be present at a death is to be present on Holy Ground. Because our society tends to shy away from talk of death and dying many don't want to even think about death. I think it is far healthier to talk about death when we are healthy and not facing imminent death than it is to wait until it is too late to do so. Knowing a loved one's final wishes can make those decisions so much easier when the time comes to honor them.

The memorial cards from McComb Funeral homes read: "The funeral service is for the living because it enables family and friends to gather to express their feelings. It's a time to pay tribute, reflect on memories, gain strength from others and begin to accept one of life's may changes. A funeral service lets you and those close to you say goodbye and begin the healing process.

Your presence at this funeral is of immeasurable value. You're contributing to a fellowship of support extended to the family and relatives. For them, your attendance is comforting and reassuring. They know that you care and want to acknowledge the life that was lived. By being here, you're helping to make this service a memorable one."

Many times family members, following services for their loved one, tell me that the sound of the congregation surrounding them with song and prayer was more uplifting than they could express. I have often wished churches had a group of members who would commit to attending the visitation and service of church members who die whether you know the deceased or not.

Also important is visiting the member prior to death. While people often don't know what to say in such situations, the following are some brief points to keep in mind:

- Don't be phony all cheerful and happy and trying to get the dying person to cheer up or have a "stiff upper lip." Avoid baby talk, being cutesy and patronizing.
- Don't try to have "answers." Don't Preach. Don't say, "Hi, how are you?"
- Don't hesitate to talk about death if the dying person mentions it first.
- Do be sincere and genuine.
- Do let the other person talk if they are in a talkative mood.

 They may not be coherent. They may repeat themselves. It doesn't matter. If you don't know what to say tell them that.
- Do be present in the situation. When there are no words, just be there. Listen.
- Do stay by the person. Let them know you are there. Hold their hand if appropriate.

Life is full of awesome moments. The moment a baby takes its first breath and "comes to life" is one such moment. The moment one dies is another. Just as no two births are the same, the same may be said of deaths. But each is holy ground.

January Session Highlights

- The newly elected deacons and elders shared their faith stories with the Session. Their ordination/installation date was then set for January 22
- The 16 item Annual Consent Agenda was passed. These 16 items contain all the details that have to be put in place each year like communion dates, election of treasurer and clerk of session, officers of the corporation, etc.
- Review of the By-laws session recommends to the congregation a change in the Date of the fall congregational meeting, to allow for more training of officers prior to their ordination/installation, and a change to the required quorum for both session meetings and congregational meetings.
