A Word from the Interim Pastor

Your Pastor Nominating Committee is hard at work reading and evaluating the Personal Information Forms submitted to them – not an easy task. Pray for them that their work will be blessed by God and lead to the calling of your next installed pastor. As soon as a candidate is selected and approved by the Committee on Ministry of Whitewater Valley Presbytery, notice will be made and dates announced as to when everything will take place.

The Personnel Committee is moving forward looking for a part-time secretary, and a Nursery attendant. Part time employees can be difficult to find so this may take time to find the right person.

With all the above coming closer to fruition, I have been looking at my next moves. I love living in Fort Wayne: therefore, I decided to retire here at the conclusion of my interim ministry with you. However, I still want to work part time in some form of ministry. First Presbyterian Church announced they were looking for a Part-time Parish Associate for Pastoral Care with support to the Board of Deacons and to help them reactivate their Stephen's Ministry. I applied and was offered the position. This position will include only 2 Sundays a year in their pulpit.

At a called joint meeting of the Session and Board of Deacons on Sunday, May 7, the Session voted to approve, effective September 1, my continuing to work at Grace 2/3 time and at First 1/3 time. This will allow me to continue at Grace for as long as is needed, and still be able to begin my work at First. And the reality is that you may have a new pastor by September 1, in which case it is all academic. The financial details of what this means will be worked out between the stated clerk of presbytery, and the Board of Pensions of the PC(USA). In part, my decision to retire means that the 3-month transition clause which is part of an interim contract is now off the table as I will retire when I am done at Grace, but will then just have a part-time job.



Pat Morrison attends two Center for Congregation workshops

Invigorating Congregational Life through Youth Ministry

This workshop stressed the importance of including the youth of the church in the life of the church. Dr. David Rahn led the discussion of following Jesus' example to let the children come to Him. Rahn gave examples of including youth of all ages in the weekly or twice-weekly service. When youth are shuttled to the side and made to feel "too young" to understand what they are doing, they may never think they're old enough to know what is going on. Or they may just lose interest in joining the party that is praising God.

As usual, it was a very interesting workshop.

Thriving Teams: Promoting Good Leadership, Creativity and Accomplishment

Dr. Aleze Fulbright led a discussion of thriving teams in a church setting by listing the five dysfunctions that can sink a team.

- 1. Absence of Trust
- 2. Fear of Conflict
- 3. Lack of Commitment
- 4. Avoidance of Accountability.
- 5. Inattention to Results

Don't be surprised if Pat shows up at a meeting with a hand full of papers to fill out. These will help find out if your committee (team) has any dysfunctions.
