

In 2014, a group of folks at Grace began to explore the idea of developing an endowment program at Grace. The result of their efforts was a resolution adopted by Session on October 16, 2016 that established the Grace Legacy Ministry. Among the Ministry's purposes is:

"to sustain, strengthen, and extend Grace's on-going mission and ministry, now and in the future, by providing financial support for mission projects, ministry programs and capital improvements normally outside the operating budget of the Church"

At the center of this endeavor is a permanent endowment fund (the Grace Legacy Fund) whose income from investments will be used to fulfill this purpose.

During worship on Reformation Sunday, October 29, the Grace Legacy Ministry will be introduced. Additional information will become available at that time.

Then on All Saints Sunday, November 5, a special offering will be received that will represent the initial funding of the Grace Legacy Fund.
