Christmas is a difficult season for a lot of people. For many, it is a time of difficult memories, of missing loved ones, of feeling desperately lonely and depressed. For others, it is just too busy or taxing to be enjoyed, with the tasks of getting ready for celebrations, planning how to handle the financial burden of gift giving, or even just having a job that involves a cash register and toys or something similar.

It is easy – and forgivable – to miss the joy of our savior’s birth for all the tasks we have to do to “properly” celebrate our savior’s birth. And when it is not a happy time of year for you because of whatever weighs on your soul, the demand for you to be happy when you simply cannot pulls you further from the joy of the event.

Jesus came into a broken world of chaos. In the first years of his life, he was whisked away to Egypt for his protection. His life would lead him to a terrible end, an end that Mary would have to watch.

But for a few moments, a mother, step-father, and some shepherds celebrated the joy of the event.

This Christmas, give yourself the gift of quiet and prayer. Spend time just celebrating our savior’s birth, praying to our loving God, and feeling the Holy Spirit, not because you should or because it is proper, but to give your soul time to feel the joy. Spend time reading scripture and letting the Word work within you. Spend time away from the hustle and bustle, instead focusing solely on the baby Jesus.

This month you get two articles from me. I could not bring myself to have this as my sole article on the front of the newsletter, but this article is definitely more important.

We are required annually to notify the congregation of our Child and Youth Protection Policy and Sexual Misconduct Policy, and there is a hesitation to even talk about this because it is uncomfortable. It is not happy, it is not what we want to talk about, and we often just want to ignore it.

In a bit of a weird coincidence, the same day that John let the session know that we had not given the congregation its annual notification of our policies, the hashtag #churchtoo was trending on Twitter, telling stories of how churches have been complicit in and even facilitated abuse and assault on women, children, and men, and looked the other way because it was uncomfortable or the one who was responsible was beloved.

That should never happen here. Everyone must be safe here, and if they are not, that needs to be corrected and the danger removed. We have good policies in place and anyone can look at or receive a copy any time; just ask me or someone at the office like Kim. In 2018 we will be working on solidifying a reporting policy for misconduct by any church leadership, myself included, and making sure everyone knows that there is an ear to hear and to help. Also in 2018, all

Employee's, and all volunteers who work with children, will be required to review the policies, sign receipt of the policies, and complete a youth and child protection training.

It is Christmas time and we do not like to be in dark places during joyful celebrations, but I personally cannot determine a better time to tell everyone that they are safe here, that their concerns will be heard, and they will not be silenced for the sake of order and image.

You are safe here, and you are loved. Let us continue to prove that to you.




Pastor Robert Brown's Ordination Service

Recent/current projects include the accessibility fund, Church Women United, main kitchen fund, funeral dinners, Wellspring donations, graduations, and supporting the Whitewater Valley Presbyterian Women. Ongoing projects include the collecting of UPC labels and Box Tops for Education for Crossroads Children’s Home, helping with bingo at Byron Health Center, cancer pad sewing, and hosting Fellowship several times. This past year we supported the Studio in Bloom and also the 46808 Neighborhood Cleanup by holding an open cancer pad sewing on Saturday morning.

Our main fundraisers were a plant sale and garage sale with proceeds going to the main kitchen fund. There was no Christmas Sale in 2017 but we are collecting for the 2018 sale. 
